We discussed things to look out for and questions to ask when conducting 'learning walks' and 'book looks' across the schools. On a personal note this was my first visit to Wootton school and it was really enjoyable to chat to some of the children and see some of the activities they were working on in the classroom.

Reception Admission for 2022/2023

Online applications for children for Reception Year entry in September 2022 can now be submitted online, the deadline for completion is **Saturday 15th January 2022**. **The link for applications is <http://www.oxfordshire.gov.uk/primaryadmissions>** , The 15th January closing date is extremely important, as late applications will not be considered until May 2022 after the first offers have been made. Parents with older children already in the school do still need to apply for a place for a younger child. It is not automatic that a younger sibling will be offered a place.
