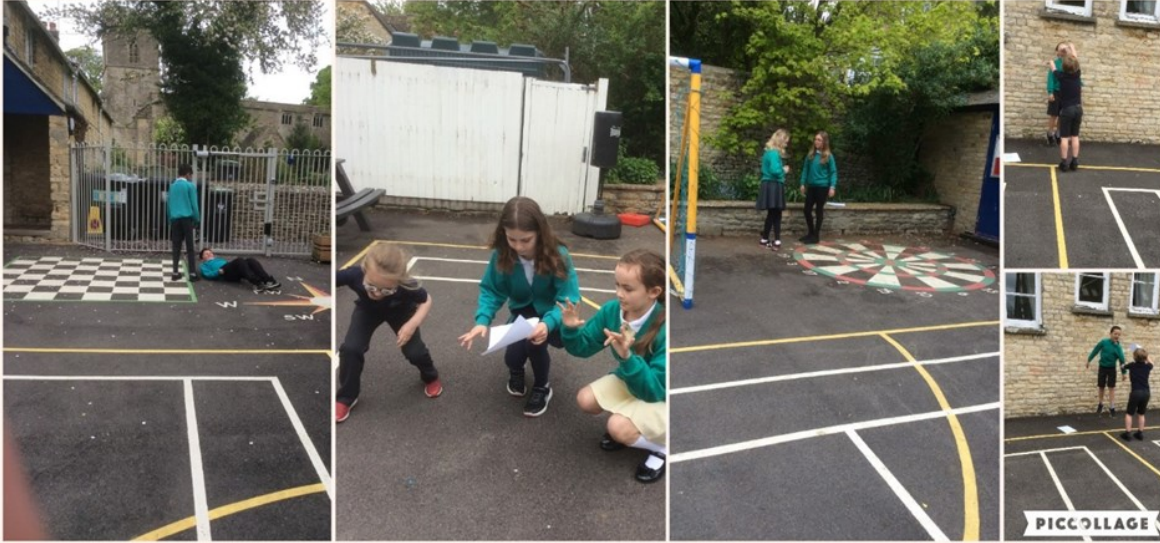

This term in Science we have been learning about materials. We have completed several investigations looking at properties of materials, including which materials are electrical conductors and electrical insulators.

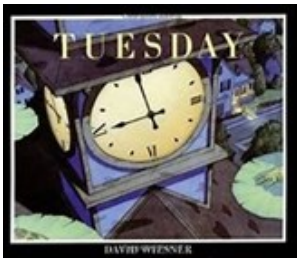
